Attached you will find the General Fund and the two Utility Fund monthly financial reports for the period ended **July 31, 2019.** This report represents the activity for **ten (10)** unaudited **months** or **83%** of the fiscal year. For the General Fund the total revenues are reported at **81%** of budget and total expenditures are reported at **72%** which both are in line with expectations. The City Charter signifies budgetary control at the Fund level and staff projects that actual revenues will exceed expenditures and therefore no budget amendments are expected.

In the Utility Funds, revenues are 62% and 81% for the City of Fulshear Utility (COF) and Cross Creek Ranch Utility (CCR) Funds, respectively. Service revenue in each utility funds are not recorded until billed therefore for example; October's utility revenues are not billed until early November. Expenditures are at 82% of budget for the COF Utility and 76% for the CCR Utility. Revenues and expenses in the Utility Funds will be monitored for possible budgetary amendments if needed.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The plat, as submitted for consideration, generally meet the requirements set forth in the City's Subdivision Ordinance No. 04-913 and/or 013-1091, which is in alignment with Chapter 21, Texas Local Government Code. Plat comments noted in the City Engineer's report are provided in support of the rules and regulations governing plats and subdivisions of land within the City's territorial limits and the extra territorial jurisdiction to promote safe, orderly, and healthful development of the City.

The Bonterra at CCR Sec. 7 Plat shows 30 of their 87 lots as having 10' building lines. This is proposed concurrently with a 20' garage building line. This deviation is allowed per the development agreement and Ordinance No. 04-913 which allows for 5% of the development to consist of adjusted setbacks and "specialty housing products". Exhibits demonstrating this building setback on a site plan level are provided in the packet.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends the City Council approve the plat under consideration.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

As discussed previously, City Staff has worked with KKC to complete Phase 1 of a Coordinated Development Ordinance (CDO) process that resulted in a review of several ordinances to streamline our processes and make sure that the ordinances are reflective of the City's intent concerning development regulations and that all individual components are complements of each other. Phase 1 will end with an Ordinance Advisory Committee (OAC) meeting on August 27th, followed by a joint P&Z/City Council meeting the same evening.

This work order is being presented for consideration that continues the CDO Review project and continues staff and KKC efforts from one phase to the next seamlessly. This will be Phase 2 and 3 of the overall process that will require the involvement of many stakeholders throughout the City and its ETJ. These phases as outlined in the work order will begin immediately utilizing available funding. Phase 2 and 3 has a not to exceed cost of \$118,454. Per request of Council, some items from Phases 2 and 3 were incorporated into the Phase 1 timeframe. The formal authorization was not amended, so we are requesting ratification and approval to complete Phases 2 and 3. No additional appropriations are needed at this time. Council approved funding for future phases of the CDO project as a part of the FY19 budget process. A portion will also be budgeted for in FY20.

City staff would recommend City Council authorize staff to proceed with the work order as presented per the current on-call agreement with Kendig Keast Collaborative.

The On-Call Services Agreement between the City of Fulshear and Kendig Keast Collaborative, executed on December 17, 2014 provides for two forms of service, as authorized by the City through the On-Call Professional Services Agreement, including:

- Seneral On-Call Services, which involve consultant personnel being available on an on-call, as-needed basis to provide general and/or ongoing technical planning assistance to City staff as particular needs emerge or evolve, including availability for periodic meeting attendance. The specific types of assistance may be only broadly defined and relatively open-ended at the outset of work, which is why the method of compensation is an hourly rate basis as described in the On-Call Professional Services Agreement. The City and consultant may mutually establish certain parameters for this services arrangement, such as a total cost target based on available budget or expected duration of the technical support role.
- Work Order Services, which involve more narrowly focused and clearly defined tasks for which a specific Scope of Services is prepared by the Consultant and approved by the Client after any mutually agreed revisions and prior to initiation of work. These services would result in one or more specified deliverables that are itemized and described in the Scope of Services, along with a definite number and type of meetings requiring consultant attendance and facilitation or other support, and a timeline and associated compensation for all work activities included in the Scope of Services. This services arrangement may involve completion of only one work order or could lead to a series of work authorizations, each of which is considered an amendment to the overall On-Call Professional Services Agreement. For work order services the method of compensation involves the City reimbursing the consultant for actual costs incurred in carrying out a particular Scope of Services, subject to an agreed upon maximum not-to-exceed amount indicated in the work order.

Phase 1 of 4 - Coordinated Development Ordinance (CDO)

The City adopted a Comprehensive Plan on May 6, 2014 after a months-long process of engaging the citizenry and working with the Parks and Recreation Commission, Planning and Zoning Commission, the Mayor and City Council, and City staff. In December 2014, an on-call agreement was executed with Kendig Keast Collaborative (KKC) to provide planning consulting to the City to aid in the implementation of the plan. Through this ongoing agreement, numerous work orders were executed by the City for drafting and amending individual ordinances (e.g., architectural standards, standards for hotels, etc.) toward preparation of a Coordinated Development Ordinance (CDO), inclusive of all development-related provisions; creation of an annotated outline (proposed table of contents) for the series of ordinances; organizing and writing a Development Guidebook, including all checklists and new applications for each required approval or permit; developing a cloud-based program for application intake, payment, processing, and management; and establishing an interactive website for the development-related provisions included in Chapters 18, 28, 32, 34, and 42 and Appendices A - C.

Over the years, as needed, the City has adopted a series of individual ordinances to address certain issues or topics. As they relate to subdivision and land development, these ordinances include:

- Chapter 18, Environment;
- Chapter 28, Signs;
- Chapter 32, Access Management;
- Chapter 34, Subdivision of Land;
- Chapter 42, Vegetation;

- Appendix A, Zoning;
- Appendix B, Airport Zoning Regulations; and
- Appendix C, Thoroughfare Plan.

Since these ordinances were prepared over a number of years and produced independent of one another, increasingly, the administration of these ordinances has become problematic and troublesome for development applicants, City staff, and the Planning & Zoning Commission. Issues have arisen on multiple occasions where significant, substantive errors, oversights, conflicts, and inconsistencies both within and across these ordinances have been discovered in the course of project review. These have caused difficulty in decision making, delayed processes and approvals, and frustrated all involved. This reflects poorly on the City. Furthermore, with the adoption of the Comprehensive Plan, the above ordinances do not reflect the community-supported directions of the plan. With the CDO, they would be updated to be in lockstep with the City's policies and goals.

As a continuation of the City's efforts to implement the Comprehensive Plan and to effectively process and manage quality development, the following scope of services is to build on the work completed to date for the preparation of a well-coordinated set of development ordinances that resolves the issues regularly encountered, and takes the next step to provide the criteria, standards, and requirements necessary for the Planning & Zoning Commission, Mayor and City Council, and City staff to work with applicants in the City's economic development.

Scope of Services

The following scope of services will be undertaken as Phase 1 of 4 to begin August 10, 2018.

1.1 Project Orientation

KKC and the City's Project Director, along with invited staff, will hold a project orientation teleconference immediately following notice to proceed in order to supplement the understanding of the project relative to the delivered Annotated Outline, Development Guidebook, and Online Ordinances. Topics for discussion will include: project logistics, the number and means of identifying stakeholders and focus groups to be involved in Subtask 1.2, and the organization and structure of a Staff Technical Advisory Committee (STAC) and an Ordinance Advisory Committee (OAC). The STAC will consist of City staff members who administer, interpret, and enforce the current development regulations on a day-to-day basis. The OAC (typically 12 to 15 members) will consist of community members at large who share a greater personal or professional interest in the City's development ordinances. The OAC commonly includes a non-voting representative to the Planning and Zoning Commission and City Council. KKC will develop a tentative schedule of deliverables, meetings, and teleconferences; communication and interagency coordination protocol; and a contact database. We will also make arrangements for the prompt transmittal of additional documents, maps, or data from the City to KKC.

With the aid of KKC, the City will identify people to serve on the STAC and OAC, as well as other applicable agencies or organizations who KKC may need to contact or meet during the course of the project. The membership may be publicly solicited and/or appointed by the City Council. Any meetings will be coordinated by the City to occur during scheduled meeting days.

1.2. Stakeholder and Focus Group Interviews

Members of these focus groups and stakeholders may also serve as members of the OAC, and will include:

- Design professionals (engineers, architects, landscape architects, and surveyors);
- 2. Landowners, builders, and developers;
- 3. Brokers and realtors;
- 4. Downtown, historic preservation, economic development and redevelopment advocates;
- 5. Business owners and merchants; and
- 6. Neighborhood advocates.

Additional focus groups may be added on an Additional Services basis to include other groups as determined in coordination with the City's Project Director. Additionally, the first two-hour open-door meeting will be held to solicit general comments from interested citizens.

Additionally, team members will conduct a joint meeting with the OAC, Planning & Zoning Commission, and the City Council to overview the project approach and schedule, summarize the key findings of the stakeholder interviews, and to initiate dialog as to the key planning and regulatory issues to be addressed in the CDO.

1.4 Annotated Outline

Changes to the order or structure of Articles and Sections within the ordinances may occur during the project

in response to information developed as the project progresses. However, such changes may require an amendment if they materially add to the content of the CDO (e.g., unforeseen inclusion of additional or incremental ordinances, appendices, technical manuals, or design guidelines) or constitute a substantive change.

KKC will use the **enCode**PlusTM cloud-based codification and online code publishing software to facilitate the ordinance drafting process as a fully-searchable electronic ordinance upon completion and adoption. Upon completion of the project, the format of the CDO will be integrated with the City's Code of Ordinances hosted by Municode. Such integration will allow access from anywhere on the City's website, as well as to/from Municode.

2.2 Draft Development Design, Subdivision Standards and Procedures

KKC will develop language for the updated ordinances based on the accepted Annotated Outline, input received through the stakeholder and focus group interviews, open-door meetings, Planning & Zoning Commission and City Council meetings, and through close coordination with the City's Project Director, Staff Technical Advisory Team (STAC), Ordinance Advisory Committee (OAC), and others, as applicable.

KKC will refine the draft modules based on the feedback received from the STAC and the OAC, Planning & Zoning Commission, and City Council as each module is completed and reviewed. The refined modules will be assembled into a consolidated draft, which will be in a public hearing format inclusive of tables, graphics, illustrations, and a glossary of acronyms and definitions.

Scheduled meetings between City staff and consultant personnel, whether conducted on-site (as requested by the City) or remotely via phone or video conference, will be held as needed and agreed upon in support of the specified work assignments. Requests to attend and participate in any project-related meetings must be provided with sufficient advance notice, as mutually agreed upon, to ensure availability and avoid scheduling conflicts.

ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF FULSHEAR DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION AND THE CITY OF FULSHEAR

This Agreement is entered into by and between the **City of Fulshear Development Corporation** (hereinafter referred to as the **"Corporation"** and) the **City of Fulshear**, Texas (hereinafter referred to as the **"CITY"**).

WHEREAS, the **CORPORATION** and CITY wish to aid, and cooperate with each other in coordinating certain functions and services including administrative services for the effective, efficient operation of the **CORPORATION** and the provision of economic development services for the CITY; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the CITY to cooperate with the **CORPORATION** in that the **CORPORATION** is a public instrumentality acting on behalf of the CITY in furtherance of the public purposes of the Development Corporation Act of 1979, now located in Texas Local Government Code, Title 12, Subtitle C1; and

WHEREAS, the governing body of CITY has duly authorized this agreement; and

Use of City Facilities

Adequate office space for **CORPORATION** daily operations, utilities and common space (restrooms, break rooms and storage) will be provided by the City. Utilities include telephone service and hardware, internet connections, and shared building utilities. Also, the CITY agrees to allow the **CORPORATION** to post notices for public hearings, special or regular meetings or workshops.
- 2. The CITY agrees to share a Post Office box and a box at City Hall for receipt of mail to the **CORPORATION** and to disseminate any and all mail to the **CORPORATION** box at City Hall without charge.

Services to be Provided

The CITY agrees to provide the following services to the **CORPORATION** pursuant to the City Manager's direction and approval, and such employees furnishing said services are to be considered at all times to be employees of the CITY.

- a. Economic Development Director Services
 - 1. Develop and implement strategies for the retention, expansion, and recruitment of business enterprises.
 - 2. Provide administrative services as required by the **CORPORATION**.
 - 3. Perform all services related to State of Texas requirements for Economic Development Corporation's reporting. Maintain all public documents and records of the Corporation.
 - 4. Prepare (in coordination with Finance Department) and administer budgets including Economic Development Department operating budget (Fund 100) and Corporation operating budget (Fund 600) and projects fund budget (Fund 601) in accordance with City, Corporation, and State purchasing and expenditure requirements.

Once adopted, and approved by the City Council, the Economic Development Director shall be allowed to expend any funds within operating budgets (Fund 100 and Fund 600) for purposes described in the budgets without further Corporation approval.

At no time shall any funds be expended from the projects fund (Fund 601) without prior Corporation approval. Except that expenditures under \$10,000 identified during the budgeting process from the promotional and studies line items in the Projects Fund may be expended by staff in accordance with the budget without additional approval of the Corporation.

- b. Economic Development Coordinator Services
 - Assist the Economic Development Director in the development and implementation of sound, fact-based economic development strategies to retain, expand and recruit business enterprises, and in the day-to-day operation of the CITY's and CORPORATION's economic development programs.
- c. Finance and Accounting
 - Payment of any and all bills submitted by the CORPORATION within CORPORATION budgetary and bylaw requirements. The City accepts no responsibility for the accuracy of bills submitted.
 - Receive, manage and invest CORPORATION funds in accordance with the CORPORATION's Investment Policy, as may be adopted and amended from time to time. The CORPORATION follows the CITY's adopted and amended Investment Policy.

- 3. Maintenance of accounting records, including but not limited to general ledger, income and expense accounts, balance sheet, and annual financial report/audit.
- 4. Process annual budgets, and provide monthly budget reports and Corporation financials.

d. Other Services

- 1. The **CORPORATION** may request other needed services from the CITY via the City Manager.
- 2. Funds for general economic development legal services not specific to the Corporations will be provided for in the Economic Development Department operating budget (Fund 100). General legal services for the Corporation, including advice, the review and preparation of resolutions, general contracts, and other legal documents or records for the Corporation shall be funded by the Corporation in its operating budget (Fund 600). Legal services provided in regard to specific Corporation-initiated projects will be charged to the individual project.

Compensation

In consideration for the services and related costs provided by the CITY for the benefit of the CORPORATION, the CORPORATION agrees to reimburse the CITY's costs for performing such services in an amount not to exceed the total "ASA Reimbursement" line item in the Corporation's approved fiscal year budget, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit "A".

Estimated amounts will be prepared concurrently with the establishment of the annual budget, will be billed to the **CORPORATION** in arrears at least quarterly, and will be reconciled to actual costs incurred (except for funding for Community Events).

The Corporation shall provide payment as set forth in the Corporation's annual operating budget (Fund 600) under the "ASA Reimbursement" line item, equivalent to 50% of the City's Economic Development Department operating costs as outlined in the City's Fund 100 budget, which includes funding for Economic Development Personnel, Equipment and Supplies, Dues and Memberships, Professional and Legal Services, Travel and Training, and Programming. The Corporation's budget commitment is based upon budget projections provided by the City. Said sum shall be payable on a reimbursement basis to the City and be due upon presentment of an invoice from the City to the Corporation (except for Community Events funding).

In addition, the **CORPORATION** agrees to pay the CITY a fee for related support costs in an amount not to exceed the total "**ASA Shared Services Fee**" line item in the Corporation's approved fiscal year budget. This fee shall be paid in advance in four quarterly payments to the City for associated City General Fund costs to administer the Corporation.

For Fiscal Year 2020, the ASA Shared Services Fee includes costs for the City Manager, Chief Financial Officer, Finance Manager, and Accounts Payable/Payroll Clerk, for time and related costs.

The Corporation may provide funding as outlined in their annual operating budget (Fund 600), for transfers to the Corporation's *Projects Fund* (Fund 601) to be administered by City personnel under the direction of the Corporation. For Fiscal Year 2020, these transfers include funding for targeted incentives; promotional expenses; professional services (studies, planning, and program development); Corporation Livable Center Implementation projects, Corporation Economic Development Strategic Plan Implementation projects; and Corporation Gateway, Corridor, and Placemaking Enhancements.

The Corporation will provide funding for *Community Events* as outlined in the budgets for transfers to the City's General Fund to be administered directly by the City under the City Manager's direction pursuant to the terms of agreements between the City and third parties for all community events.

Period of Duration

This Agreement shall remain in force and effect for a one-year period. The parties agree to use best efforts to continue this Agreement from year to year. The Agreement shall be reviewed annually, and any modifications or extension of the terms and conditions of the Agreement shall be of no force and effect except in a subsequent document in writing signed by the parties hereto.

This agreement will have no force or effect until duly executed by all parties hereto, will run concurrent to the City and Corporation's fiscal year (October 1 through September 30), terminating at 12:01 a.m. on October 1, 2020.

The **CORPORATION** and the CITY may cancel this agreement at any time upon sixty (60) days written notice to the other party. The obligations of the **CORPORATION**, including its obligation to pay the CITY for all costs incurred under this agreement prior to such notice, shall survive such cancellation, as well as any other obligation incurred under this agreement, until performed or discharged by the **CORPORATION**.

Nothing in this Agreement shall constitute a waiver by the Parties of governmental immunity nor shall the Parties' enforcement of any legal right or assertion of any affirmative defense arising out of this Agreement constitute a waiver of the Parties' governmental immunity. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed as express or implied consent of the Parties to being sued.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

On July 15, the Fulshear Development Corporation (FDC) declared projects for Fiscal Year 2019-2020 (FY20), finding that budgeted expenditures will promote or develop new or expanded business enterprises. The FDC adopted Resolution FDC 19-01 at the same meeting, declaring the projects, directing staff to publish notice of the same, and setting a public hearing date for August 19, 2019.

The project notice was run in the legal section of the City's paper of record, the Fort Bend Herald, on July 18, beginning a 60-day period for public petition regarding the expenditures. A public hearing on the projects was held at the Corporation's August 19, 2019 Meeting. Staff will provide an update at the Council meeting regarding whether or not there were any speakers.

In addition to the public notice and hearing requirements, the Texas Local Government Code requires the authorizing entity (City Council) to adopt a resolution authorizing the projects after giving the resolution at least two separate readings before the EDC may spend funds related to specific projects. This is due to the City's population being under 20,000, and the proposed specific project expenditure amount being greater than \$10,000.
