Phase III will focus on an amphitheater, additional parking, walking trails, a playground, pavilion, additional detention requirements, and restroom facility. Phase III will also include improvements to Phase II to include a restroom and concession building, sport courts, sport field lighting, score boards, walking trails, a playground, associated appurtenances, and a maintenance building.

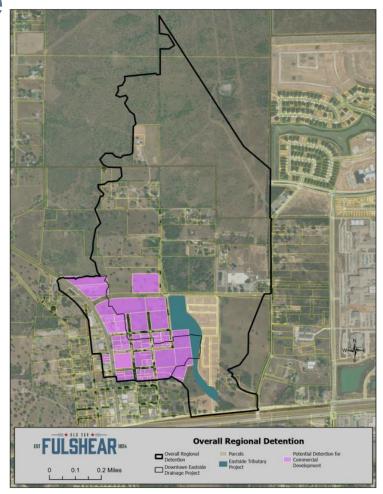

Downtown Eastside Drainage

Project Scope:

The Downtown Eastside Drainage (4th Street) project was identified in the FY2019 Downtown Drainage Study. This project will establish a new storm sewer system in the east portion of the downtown area to provide for proper drainage flows to the existing drainage way. This also allows for the City to abandon storm sewer lines currently running underneath existing structures on private property. The extensive drainage system will run along 4th Street, 4th Street will be reconstructed and incorporate the council approved street cross-sections for the downtown area in a 60' ROW.

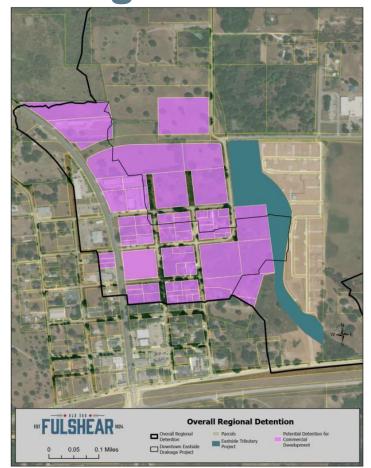

Eastside Tributary Drainage Improvements

Project Scope:

The Eastside Tributary Drainage Improvement project was identified in the FY2019 Downtown Drainage Study. This project will provide improvements to the existing Fulshear Lake Tributary. The proposed channel will be improved to convey the 100year storm design between Huggins Road and FM 1093. The Downtown Eastside Drainage (Fourth Street) project will also drain to this tributary, adding additional capacity to the east side of Downtown Fulshear. Additionally, this project will provide for the construction of a linear park that will include a trail system.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Sales Tax

Sales tax revenues received in April 2024 (February 2024 remittances) were up 7% from the same period the previous year. Each Corporation's sales tax revenues total \$127,097.47 or 43.23% of budget for 42% (5/12) of the year (FY24) complete.

Financials

There were \$31,161.32 in FDC Operating Fund (700) expenditures. There were \$1,500.00 of FDC Projects Fund (701) expenditures.

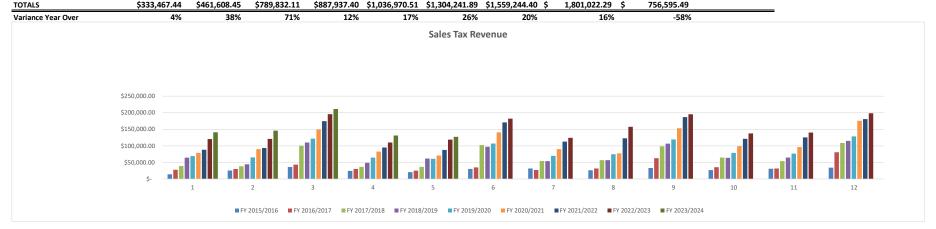
Payables

1. Call to Order

Tommy Kuykendall called the meeting to order at 6:01 p.m. and noted Lee O'Brien's absence.

3. Presentation and discussion on EDC funding of CIP projects for the 2024-2025 fiscal year.

Tiffany Stodder presented three CIP projects for Board consideration, these included Eastside Drainage Improvements, Eastside Tributary Improvements, and Primrose Park.

Joel Patterson asked for clarification over the dates listed on the chart. Tiffany Stodder gave clarification that the funding they were asking for would be out of the FY25 section of the cart.

James Buccieri and Jennifer Hagemann asked for clarification on the three phases of Primrose Park. Tiffany Stodder provided a breakdown.

Tommy Kuykendall asked for clarification on what portion of the downtown area would benefit from the east side drainage project. Stephen Wilcox noted that the magenta area would be the benefactor of the improvements.

James Buccieri inquired if the projects had been supported by the EDC corporations in the past. Annel Guadalupe noted that funds had been assigned for eastside drainage in the past, though they were not utilized. Those funds instead were moved to the Harris Street project.

Stephen Wilcox provided clarification on the drainage and tributary projects, noting that it would be a complete drainage revamp in that portion of downtown, and that those projects can be completed independent of one another, though they both work together.

Tommy Kuykendall and James Buccieri asked that an itemized list of potential parks projects be provided so the board may entertain the support of very specific projects that align with EDC goals.

4. Update on Harris Street reconstruction.

Tiffanny Stodder advised the Board on the current state of the Harris Street project. Plans have been reviewed and comments have been submitted by staff. The target for bid advertisement will be in April with a 30–45-day advertisement window.

5. a. February 19th – March 15th Activity Overview:

1. Bicentennial Event
